

Riverside Golf Course Zagreb – LOCAL RULES

A-1 Defining Boundaries

Out of bounds on holes 1, 2, 3, 15, 16 and 18 is defined by the line between the course-side points at ground level of white stakes and fence posts.

E-1 Dropping Zones on holes 7 and 17

Hole 7 : If a ball comes to rest in the penalty area the player may drop the original ball or another ball in the dropping zone, adding **one penalty stroke**.

Hole 17 : If a ball comes to rest in **the penalty area on the left side** (beyond the path) of hole 17 the player may drop the original ball or another ball in the dropping zone, adding **one penalty stroke**.

The dropping zone is a relief area under Rule 14.3.

E-3 Preferred Lies

When a player's ball lies in a part of the general area cut to fairway height or less in the cutting line, the player may prefer the lie within one Score Card length. This Rule applies for Holes No. : 1,3,4,6,8,9,13.

E-10 Protection of Young Trees

The young trees identified by stakes or (and) plastic rings or small flags are **no play zones**:

If a player's ball lies anywhere on the course other than in a penalty area and it lies on or touches such a tree or such a tree interferes with the player's stance or area of intended swing, the player **must take relief** under Rule 16.1f.

F-1 Defining Abnormal Course Conditions and Integral Objects

Ground under repair is defined by any area encircled by tape or line. Tree stumps, areas with soil or sand accumulation in general area, are ground under repair.

Fixed irrigation system, benches, signs, ball cleaning boxes, trash bins, shelter houses, electric fence on Hole No. 4 and No. 15 are IMMOVABLE obstructions. Relief is available if the ball lies in the general area (rule 16.1).

F-4 Extensive Damage Due to Heavy Rain and Traffic

Ground under repair may include areas of unusual damage, including areas where spectators or other traffic have combined with wet conditions to alter the ground surface materially, but only when so declared by an authorized referee or member of the Committee.

F-9 Relief from Tree Roots in Fairway

If a player's ball in the general area has interference from tree roots in the fairway or in the rough within two club lengths of the fairway, free relief is available under Rule 16.1b. But interference does not exist if the tree roots only interfere with the player's stance.

F-16 Bunker Filled with Temporary Water

Bunker flooded with temporary water and marked with green stake is ground under repair. The player may take free relief under Rule 16.1b.

F-17 All Roads and Paths Treated as Obstructions

All roads and paths on the course covered with gravel, even if not artificially-surfaced, are treated as immovable obstructions from which free relief is allowed under Rule 16.1.

J-1 Methods for Stopping and Resuming Play

A suspension of play for a dangerous situation will be signalled by one prolonged air horn note. All other types of suspension will be signaled by three consecutive airhorn notes, repeated. Resumption of play will be signaled by two short airhorn notes. (Rule 5.7b)
