

# Local Rules

CHAMPIONSHIP COURSE



## **Out of bounds (MLR A-1)**

The boundaries of the course on holes 1, 2, 3, 15, 16, and 18 are marked by an imaginary line between the inner edges of the white stakes at ground level.

The green wire fence in front of the clubhouse terrace marks the boundary of the course.

## **Dropping zones (MLR E-1.1)**

Hole 7: If a player's ball ends up in the penalty area, the player has an additional option to drop the ball in the drop zone with one penalty stroke.

Hole 17: If a player's ball ends up in the left penalty area (behind the pathway), the player may drop the ball in the drop zone near the bridge with one penalty stroke.

## **Protection of young trees (MLR E-10.1)**

Young trees marked with wooden stakes or plastic rings are no-play zones. If a player's ball is anywhere on the course except in a penalty area and is touching such a tree or if the tree interferes with stance or stroke execution, the player must take relief without penalty under Rule 16.1f.

## **Defining abnormal course conditions (MLR F-1)**

Ground under repair is defined by any area encircled by a white line.

Electric wires on holes 4 and 15 are immovable obstructions, and free relief is available under Rule 16.1b.

All gravel-covered pathways are immovable obstructions, and free relief is available under Rule 16.1b.

Areas in Bunkers where sand has been removed by the movement of water resulting in deep furrows through the sand are ground under repair.

All cherry laurels are ground under repair, and free relief is available under Rule 16.1b.

Three stumps are considered ground under repair, and free relief is available under Rule 16.1.

## **Bunkers filled with temporary water (MLR F-16)**

Bunkers marked with blue stakes containing temporary water are considered ground under repair in the general area.

Free relief is available under Rule 16.1b.

## **Sandless bunkers (hole 15)**

Fairway bunker on 15th hole that contains no sand is considered ground under repair in the general area, and the player is entitled to free relief under rule 16.1 B
