

Local Rules

COMPETITION COURSE- 25.09.2025



Course boundaries (MLR A-1)

Course boundaries on holes 1, 2, 3, 15, 16, and 18 are marked by an imaginary line between the inner edges of white stakes at ground level.

A green wire fence in front of the clubhouse terrace marks the course boundary.

Drop zone (MLR E-1.1)

Hole 7: If a player's ball ends up in a penalty area, the player has the additional option to drop the ball in the drop zone with a one-stroke penalty.

Hole 17: If a player's ball ends up in the left penalty area (behind the path), the player may drop the ball in the drop zone near the small bridge with a one-stroke penalty.

Protection of young trees (MLR E-10.1)

Young trees marked with wooden stakes or plastic collars are no-play zones.

If a player's ball lies anywhere on the course except in a penalty area and it touches such a tree or the tree interferes with the player's stance or the execution of a stroke, the player must take relief without penalty under Rule 16.1f.

Definition of abnormal course conditions (MLR F-1)

All gravel paths, electric fences (wires) on holes 4 and 15, and antenna systems (metal poles) located in the general area of the course on holes 3, 9, 13, 14, and 15 are immovable obstructions, and relief without penalty is available under Rule 16.1b.

Ground under repair on fairways and general areas is marked (circled) with white or blue spray lines.

Areas considered as ground under repair are:

- areas in bunkers where water has washed away sand leaving depressions,
- all cherry laurels,
- all tree stumps,
- the pile of fertile soil in the general area between hole 4 and the tee-off of hole 5, and
- all trenches dug for installation of electrical wiring for antenna systems controlling autonomous electric mowers, and relief without penalty is available for each of these under Rule 16.1b.

Temporary water in bunkers (MLR F-16)

Bunkers containing temporary water and marked as such with a blue stake are defined as ground under repair in the general area and are not treated as bunkers; the player is entitled to relief without penalty under Rule 16.1b.

Bunker without sand (hole 15)

The fairway bunker on hole 15 with no sand is defined as ground under repair in the general area and is not treated as a bunker; the player is entitled to relief without penalty under Rule 16.1b.

Free relief (MLR E-3)

When a player's ball lies on the fairway of hole 4 or 13, the player may without penalty mark and lift the ball and place it within one club length, but not nearer the hole.

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
